You are receiving this email as a result of your response to the Handheld Survey that was conducted by AHC-IS in December of 2007.

After the upcoming MeetingMaker upgrade, synchronizing your Windows Mobile device to your MeetingMaker calendar will change. The Intellisync software that was used in the past will no longer function with version 8.6.3 of MeetingMaker.

As a replacement for Intellisync, AHC IS has purchased a server that is capable of syncing the MeetingMaker calendar over a WiFi or data connection, as opposed to the current process of cradle syncing using Intellisync. The NotifyLink server will also allow for syncing email to the Windows Outlook on the Windows Mobile device.

This service is entirely optional but if you choose to take advantage of the technology, you must meet the following criteria:

- Your Windows Mobile device MUST have Wifi or cellular capability – i.e. the device must have a wireless card that can authenticate to the U of M wireless or user must have a data package from their phone provider.
- You must purchase a NotifyLink license for a one time charge of \$125.
- Your email must be configured to use IMAP (server based), not POP.
- If the device using Intellisync is not a University asset, i.e. a personal phone, you must be willing to follow specific installation steps to install and configure the NotifyLink communications.
- If the device IS a University asset, an AHC IS Field tech will be available to assist in configuring the device.

If you meet the criteria and are interested in using the NotifyLink server to sync your MeetingMaker calendar and U of M email, please send a response to [ahc-is@umn.edu](mailto:ahc-is@umn.edu) with a valid CUFs account so AHC IS can obtain the necessary license.

If you do not choose to use this service, syncing via Intellisync will not work after the upgrade on April 26-27, 2008.
